PREFACE

The AMDA Seminar on 'Planning and Development of Metropolitan Regions in the context of Special Initiatives relating to Infrastructure Development and Provision of Basic Services' organised on 17 November, 2007 at India Habitat Centre, New Delhi discussed a wide range of issues based on ten papers (Annex-I) presented in the Seminar.

The Seminar focussed on the following three sub-themes:

- 1. Urbanisation and Metropolitan Regions: The Emerging Role of Urban and Regional Planning in the context of SEZs
- 2. Sustainable Development in Metropolitan Regions in the context of JNNURM
- 3. Mainstreaming Urban Poor and Provision of Urban Basic Services within the Framework of Master Plans

The objectives of the Seminar were:

- to stimulate awareness about the new challenges facing metropolitan regions emerging from investments in SEZs located nearby, inmigration from rural areas, growth of population as well as diversification of activities and how such activities should be spatially integrated in the metropolitan regional planning process;
- to identify the role of strategic infrastructure in managing rapid growth of metropolitan regions; and
- to look into the current planning process of cities with a view to promoting social inclusion and provision of housing and basic services to the urban poor.

In order to focus national attention on various problems facing metropolitan cities and their regions, the Seminar brought together 77 participants (Annex-II) comprising representatives from municipalities, development authorities, policy makers, administrators from central and state governments and experts from national and international organisations. The Seminar examined the challenges posed by locations of industrial and concomitant economic activities in and around metropolitan cities arising out of the initiatives for building core

infrastructure – and establishment of Special Economic Zones throughout the country particularly in and around metropolitan cities.

Pursuant to the wide ranging discussions in the Seminar, it was realised that a regional planning approach is essential for the balanced socio-economic development in metropolitan regions. Most of the metropolitan cities are urban agglomerations consisting of more than one local body. These agglomerations need a metropolitan vision for effective planning and action. The Seminar demonstrated that the first prerequisite was to recognise the regional development approach which promotes the symbiotic development between cities and rural settlements thereby bringing the need to develop a wider perspective creating both physical and functional linkages at the state, regional and local levels. This can be achieved through a spatial regional planning system. The JNNURM initiatives in identified cities provide an excellent opportunity for establishing a regional framework including the spatial urban corridors.

In response to this Seminar, the AMDA will work further to carry forward the message for strengthening the linkages between metropolitan cities and spatial planning of their wider area in the countryside. I hope the exchange of ideas on planning and development of metropolitan regions, as contained in this document, will provide the impetus to the States and their planning and development authorities in delineating their path for useful initiatives for metropolitan spatial regional planning and integrated infrastructure development in the country.
